Sea Island cotton, known as "gossypium barbadense" or "black seed," is one of the most valuable and rare varieties in the world. Discovered at the beginning of the eighteenth century in the British West Indies, has a production of 0.0004% of the world long-fiber cotton, currently concentrated in areas that are tropical paradises, where the humidity rate is constant and dry seasons alternate with rainy ones.

The low temperature range between day and night during the cultivation phase prevents cotton from suffering thermal shocks and this means that the plants mature in a more homogeneous and linear way, giving the cotton a decidedly high quality.
